Elected as a member of Birmingham City Council in 1980, Albert Bore has taken a major role in the regeneration of the city.

From 1984 to 1993 he chaired the City's Economic Development Committee.

Since the mid 1980's he has held company directorships of both Aston Science Park and the National Exhibition Centre. He is also a member of Marketing Birmingham.

He was leader of Birmingham City Council from 1999-2004.

Since 1994 Sir Albert has been one of the members nominated by the UK Government to the European Union's Committee of the Regions, and was President from 2002-2004 and 1st Vice President from 2004-2006. Since February 2006 he has held the role of President – Commission for Territorial Cohesion Policy (COTER).

From 1991 to 2004 his European interest was also taken up as a member of the Executive of Eurocities a.s.b.l., a company incorporated in Belgium to promote the interests of major European cities.

In June 2005 he was appointed as the WMLGA European and International Affairs Portfolio Holder and in this role he chairs the West Midlands Regional Assembly's European and International Affairs Partnership.
